"BIG FOX" Reading Strategy

"BIG FOX" reading strategy is a way to teach kids to make the reading of a non-fiction article effective. The strategy is used for upper elementary grades. In this strategy the reading is monitored <u>before</u>, <u>during</u> and <u>after</u> using a graphic organizer shown below.

BEFORE READING

G	Graphics Tell what graphics (pictures, illustrations, maps, etc.) you see.	

DURING READING

F	Facts List two facts that you learned from the article.	
0	Opinion Write one opinion you have about what you read in the article.
